COLD CREEK STEWARDSHIP

The Stewardship's objective is to restore the forest and wildlife area and its facilities and to protect and enhance the natural resources for the enjoyment and education of the public.

2009 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Stewardship, in partnership with the Township of King and TRCA, was awarded a \$192K grant (2007-2009) from the Ontario Trillium Foundation. During the third year of the grant the following were initiated / completed:

- Tree identification signs were created & installed on trails,
- Trial head map and junction signs were created and installed,
- Spring tree planting completed to connect woodlots,
- Bird box use inventory and maintenance continued,
- Forest composition and measurement survey continued
- Education Centre hosted education courses for children in the GTA,
- High ropes, Rock Wall, Visitors'/Education centres hosted events,
- Celebration 10th Anniversary of Humber River Heritage Designation.
